Bachelor of Music in Music Business

How 2+2 Works

- The 2+2 is a four-year plan that leads to a Bachelor of Music (B.M.) degree in Music Business at WIU. Students will fill out applications for both schools, consult the advisors, faculty and catalogs from both schools for specifics. This completion guide is designed to ensure graduation in four years by taking courses at both Black Hawk College (BHC) and Western Illinois University (WIU). This guide assumes students have met all course prerequisites required by BHC and admission/audition requirements for WIU.
- Upon completion of the first-year requirements at BHC, students will receive the Music Industry Certificate. Upon completion of the second years' and summer requirements at BHC, students will receive an Associate of Arts degree. Students will be required to apply and audition to WIU and upon completion of the final two years' curriculum requirements and internship, students will receive the B.M. degree with a major in Music Business.
- A minimum cumulative grade point average of 2.00 should be achieved by the junior year and to graduate from BHC. These grade point average must be maintained for graduation as a Music Business major.
- The Bachelor of Music in Music Business is available at the WIU Macomb Campus; the Music Industry Certificate is available at the BHC Quad Cities Campus; the AA degree is available at the BHC Quad Cities or East Campuses or online.
- Students following this 2+2 plan will complete a minimum of 136-145 total credits. Students are strongly
 encouraged to discuss costs and funding sources at the start of the program with the Admissions and
 Financial Aid staff at BHC and WIU, including scholarships specifically intended for music majors.

Notes for BHC:

- 1. Minimum of 60 hours required to complete the Associate of Arts degree. Minimum of 29 hours to complete the Music Industry Certificate; required courses are identified above with an asterisk *. A total of 75 credits are required to complete both the AA degree and Music Industry Certificate.
- Grades of "C" or better are required for ENG 101 and ENG 102.
 A grade of "C" of better is required in all Music Theory courses to receive transfer credit in the major at WIU.
- MUSC 158 satisfies BHC's Non-Western studies A.A. degree graduation requirement.
- To enroll in ECON 222 instead of ECON 221 Principles of Macro Economics, students must request a course substitution from the BHC Music Chair.
- One science course must be 4 credits minimum to include a lab.

- 1. Be a part of our Transfer Admission Guarantee program (TAG) by filling out our admissions application at wiu.edu/apply and selecting TAG. You can be a part of TAG at any point prior to earning 30 credits at your community college. Go to wiu.edu/tag to find out more about this program.
- 2. Fill out the admissions application at any time and select the date you would like to transfer into WIU.

Notes for WIU:

- 1. Forty-two upper-division hours are required from a 4-year institution.
- 2. A minimum 60 hours is required from a 4-year institution.
- 3. A minimum GPA of 2.0 will be required overall, in the major and in the minor(s) (if applicable).
- 4. Must have 32 s.h. minimum completed in an approved major. At least 15 s.h. of the 32 s.h. of a major must be in courses numbered 300 or above.
- 5. WIU requires transfer students to participate on ensembles every semester at WIU.
- 6. It is possible a student may start at the 400 level of applied lessons their first semester at WIU, but up to discretion of applied faculty at WIU. Transfer students may also delay audition for upper-level lessons until end of 1st semester at WIU.
- 7. Transfer students will be required to take one Piano Class at WIU, level flexible depending on student competency.
- 8. MUS 442 Internship 3-12 SH may be taken during summer between years 3-4 or as indicated above.

Students intending to complete the degree from WIU should follow the list of courses outlined in this brochure.

Black Hawk College and Western Illinois University agree that if a student completes the Associate of Arts Degree and Music Industry Certificate and is admitted to Western Illinois University, that student shall be eligible for this Articulation Agreement.

- This Articulation Agreement is only appropriate for students who transfer from Black Hawk
 College with an Associate of Arts Degree and Music Industry Certificate that includes the
 general education courses, that are attached to this document, and who pursue a Bachelor of
 Music in Music Business from Western Illinois University. The series of courses that must be
 taken to complete the baccalaureate degree at WIU are attached to this document.
- 2. The student must satisfactorily complete the course requirements at Western Illinois University to earn a *Bachelor of Music in Music Business*.
- 3. Students admitted under this 2+2 Agreement must meet all other graduation requirements as listed in the student undergraduate catalog at Western Illinois University.
- 4. If either *Black Hawk College* or Western Illinois University changes major program requirements, general education requirements, graduation requirements, this agreement is subject to renegotiation.
